

## **Genesis and Inception**

- Cabinet decision dated 13/05/2010 (communicated vide their Order No.19/CM/2010(i), dated 17/05/2010) to establish Pharmacopoeia Commission for Indian Medicine (PCIM) as an Autonomous Body
- Cabinet decision dated 20th March 2014 (communicated vide Dept. of AYUSH Order No. A.11019/08/2010-HPC (PLIM) PCIM, dated 15/04/2014) to rename as Pharmacopoeia Commission for Indian Medicine & Homoeopathy (PCIM&H)

## Formation of the Department (Then Autonomous Registered Society)

- Initially registered as a Society under the provisions of the Societies Registration Act, 1860 (Act No. 21 of 1860) for the registration of Literary, Scientific and Charitable societies on 31/08/2010 (in compliance to Dept. of AYUSH Order No. A.11019/3/2007-PLIM-PCIM, dated 02/06/2010) in the name of Pharmacopoeia Commission for Indian Medicine (PCIM)
- Later renamed and re-registered under same provisions as Pharmacopoeia Commission for Indian Medicine & Homoeopathy (PCIM&H) on 25/06/2014
- 3) Two central laboratories namely Pharmacopoeial Laboratory for Indian Medicine (PLIM) and Homoeopathic Pharmacopoeial Laboratory (HPL) both established as subordinate offices under then Ministry of Health and Family Welfare in 1970 and 1975 respectively were designated as supporting structures of autonomous PCIM&H in due course.

## Re-establishment of PCIM&H as Subordinate office under Ministry of AYUSH

Consequent upon decision of Central Government (Cabinet decision dated 3rd June, 2020), the erstwhile autonomous PCIM&H has been re-established as a subordinate office under Ministry of AYUSH by merging into it, the two central laboratories namely PLIM and HPL (notified vide gazette dated 6th July, 2020).

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
